Proposals are encouraged on timely and relevant topics and projects that relate to the Nova Scotia Museum natural history collection. This could include research working with the existing collection and / or generating new specimens.

## **Cultural History**

An original research project designed to expand our knowledge of the cultural history of Nova Scotia, including history, archaeology, marine history and other topics that relate to the Nova Scotia Museum collection. Proposals are encouraged on timely and relevant topics and projects that relate to Nova Scotia Museum's cultural history sites or communities (geographic, linguistic, cultural or occupational). This could include research working with the existing collection and / or generating new collections with an emphasis on areas where the provincial collection is underrepresented.
