Throughout the months of January and February, the Alliance is visiting cities across Canada to meet with members of the research community and discuss the future of digital research infrastructure in Canada. Stops include Vancouver, Calgary, Toronto, Montreal, Halifax and Ottawa. These discussions are an important step in the development of the Alliance's strategic plan for 2025-30.

Report on the Research Software Funders Workshop

Last year, the Alliance and the Research Software Alliance (ReSA) hosted a successful international workshop on the theme "Investing in People:

Anticipating the Future of Research Software". The workshop brought together funders of research software, open science and open-source research software. A new report published by the Alliance and ReSA provides a complete summary of the workshop. Organizations that fund research software as a primary or secondary mandate are encouraged to participate in the ongoing Research Software Funders Forum meetings, get involved in ReSA's working groups, and participate in the next Forum held in Uppsala, Sweden, in September 2024. Researchers derive a great deal of value from a healthy research software ecosystem, and any effort designed to bring researchers, software developers, funders and policymakers together to discuss how to build a more sustainable ecosystem can only increase this value.
