

FUNDING OPPORTUNITY: HEALTH SYSTEM IMPACT FELLOWSHIP

The Health System Impact Fellowship offers embedded research opportunities for PhD trainees and postdoctoral researchers in health services and policy research and related fields. It includes two streams:

- Doctoral (PhD): \$50,000 per year for up to 1 year. (\$45,000 stipend plus \$5,000 professional development training and research allowance)
- Postdoctoral: \$155,000 total for 2 years (\$77,500 per annum). (\$70,000 stipend per year, plus \$7,500 professional development training and research allowance per year)

Together, 283 Health System Impact Fellows have been or are currently embedded within 128 health system organizations and connected to 25 universities to accelerate evidence-informed health system improvement.

APPLY NOW: LAB TO MARKET GRANTS

These grants support post-secondary institutions and their affiliates, including research hospitals and other eligible research centres, colleges, and college centres for the transfer of technologies in creating and sustaining networks dedicated to developing and delivering entrepreneurial skills training. These grants are open to institutions in all disciplines within the natural sciences, engineering, social sciences, humanities and health and are valued at up to \$10 million per year for up to 5 years.

GOVERNMENT OF CANADA ANNOUNCES NEW MEASURES TO PROTECT CANADIAN RESEARCH

The Government of Canada has announced a new Policy on Sensitive Technology Research and Affiliations of Concern. Grant applications that advance a sensitive technology research area will not be funded by the tri-agencies if any of the researchers involved are affiliated with organizations that could pose a risk to Canada's national security.

As part of this announcement, the government released two lists that provide guidance so that researchers can determine if the requirements of the new policy apply to their grant application:

- A <u>list of sensitive technology research areas</u> that support the development and advancement of new technologies. This list will allow researchers to self-assess whether their proposed research is within the scope of this new policy requirement.
- A list of <u>named research organizations</u> connected to military, national defence or state security entities that may pose a risk to Canada's national security.
