Update to Notice of Recommendation and Notice of Decision templates for the Project Grant competition:

Starting in January 2025, applicants will not be informed of their rank within the committee but will be informed of the funding "zone" that the final scores fall into. The zones will be top 90-100%, 75-90%, 50-75%, 25-50% or 0-25%. Priority announcements results will be provided on Notice of Decision. Additional notes regarding formatting errors will be provided on Notice of Recommendation.

NOTE: Applicants in the 75-90% zone at the Notice of Recommendation may or may not be funded.
