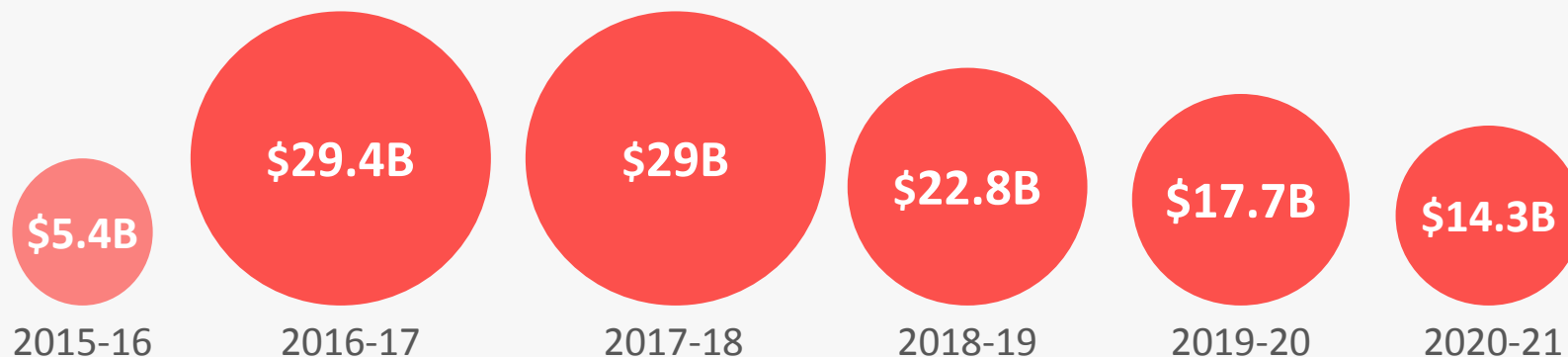

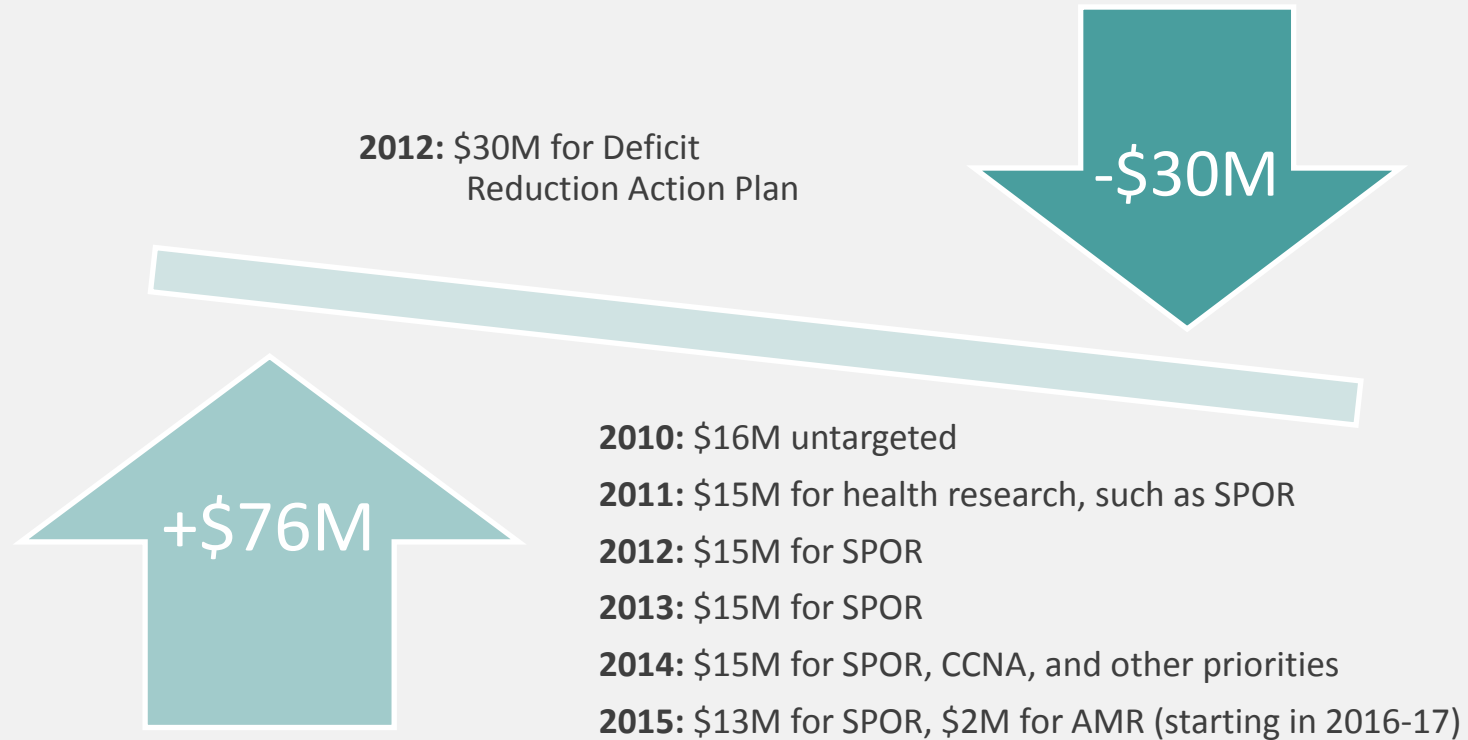
Budget 2016 highlights

Budget projects \$113.2B in deficit spending over the next five years:



- **Infrastructure:** \$120 billion over 10 years
- **Indigenous Peoples:** \$8.4 billion over five years
- **Arts:** \$1.9 billion over five years for arts and culture organizations
- Introduction of a **tax-free Childcare Benefit**

What did CIHR receive in past budgets?



Other temporary investments were also announced for CIHR, including:

- 2010: \$45M over 5 years for Postdoctoral Fellowships*
- 2011: \$53.5M over 5 years for new CECRs*
- 2012: \$10M over 2 years for Medical Isotopes
- 2014: \$5M over 5 years for CRISM, and \$1.5 B over 10 years for CFREF*

Investments in federal granting agencies

\$30M Ongoing untargeted funding to CIHR

\$30M Ongoing untargeted funding to NSERC

\$16M Ongoing untargeted funding to SSHRC

\$19M Ongoing financing to the Research Support Fund

Comprehensive review of federal support for research

- Assess opportunities to increase the impact of federal support on Canada's research excellence and the benefits that flow from it;
- Examine the rationale for current targeting of granting councils' funding and bring greater coherence to priorities and funding instruments;
- Assess the support for promising emerging research leaders; and
- Ensure there is sufficient flexibility to respond to emerging research opportunities for Canada.
