Awards are taken up in the 2019-2020 academic year US\$25,000 for 1 semester (4 months)

The Fulbright Canada Research Chair is hosted through a pre-arranged affiliation between Fulbright Canada and Dalhousie University. The specialized scholar will conduct research of importance to the university and will be encouraged to engage in campus life and to engage with students, faculty, and the broader community.

The Chair holder will deliver two formal lectures – one to Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences (FASS) faculty members and students, the other to the larger university community.

Founded in 1818 in the heart of Halifax, Nova Scotia, Dalhousie University is strongly committed to a broad scope of excellent educational programs and internationally recognized research programs in cultural and international studies and other fields. The Chair holder will be affiliated with a department in the **Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences**.

Specializations may include: social sciences, humanities, arts, and cultural studies; national, global, and interdisciplinary studies

In 1946, J. William Fulbright introduced legislation to start a new international educational exchange program with an ambitious goal – to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and the people of other countries. Excellence in scholarship, a commitment to diversity, and community service are the hallmarks of the Fulbright Program.

Eligibility:

- American Citizenship
- A PhD or equivalent professional degree, or significant experience
- Proficiency in English

Award Benefits:

- Research grant US \$25,000
- Access to prestigious network of Fulbright Scholars
- Access to world-class universities and research facilities
- Opportunity to build your network and experience a new city and university community
- Eligibility to apply for Mobility Grants to lecture at other locations in Canada during your grant period
- -Eligibility to apply for alumni grants to take on community projects
- Sabbatical, leave-of-absence, or retirement pay may be used concurrently with Fulbright Awards
