Understanding gestational weight gain through the lens of the PCCM

Framework

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Excess gestational weight gain is associated with a number of adverse outcomes for mothers and their offspring in the prenatal, intrapartum, and postpartum periods. Approximately 60% of women gain excess weight in pregnancy, and interventions targeting this health problem have been mostly unsuccessful to date.

Exploring gestational weight gain through the lens of the Patient-Centered Clinical Method framework provides a patient- and clinician-centered view that could inform future research and interventions. Recent qualitative, quantitative, and mixed-methods research will be presented to illustrate this approach.
