FEATURING KEYNOTE SPEAKER **JOHN CAMPBELL, MD, MBChB**

John Campbell is Foundation Professor of General Practice and Primary Care at the University of Exeter Medical School in Southwest England, UK. He has led the development of academic primary care in the South West Peninsula of the UK since 2002.

Dr Campbell will share his experiences on the UK journey in developing regional collaborative research groups, engaging universities, health authorities, and government decision makers in tackling PHC, and how to focus within a broad area generalist field such as PHC.

His personal research interests focus on improving access and patient experience of primary care, quality assessment in primary care (including an academic interest in multisource feedback within the context of revalidation of all UK doctors), cardiovascular risk assessment and mitigation, with studies focusing on inter-arm difference in blood pressure and early diabetes, and provision of mental health care for patients in primary care settings.

John has national academic roles in respect of the UK National Institute of Health Research Trainees Coordinating Centre (member of Doctoral Awards Panel), UK National Institute of Health Research Health Services and Delivery Research Board (member), the South West Regional Advisory Committee on Clinical Excellence Awards for senior doctors, and Chair, UK Heads of Departments Group (Society for Academic Primary Care).
