The Transitional Health Clinic for Refugees (THCfR) in Halifax Nova Scotia serves as a transitional Health Home for newly arrived refugees and claimants. The clinic model mirrors the settlement process by providing primary care for refugees during their first few years in Halifax. Once families are determined to have an adequate level of readiness for transition, they are matched with a local primary care provider. Research is currently underway on this innovative model. The model and evaluation plan will be presented.
