Registration is open for the 3rd annual Primary Health Care Research Day, presented by Collaborative Research in Primary Health Care (**CoR-PHC**). Our keynote speakers are **Dr. Jean-Frederic Levesque** and **Dr. Sabrina Wong**. Featured speakers will also include leaders from Primary Health Care and the Department of Family Practice, **Nova Scotia Health Authority**.

Speakers

Dr. Jean-Frederic Levesque is Chief Executive of the Bureau of Health Information (New South Wales). Prior to his arrival in Australia, Dr. Levesque held senior positions responsible for publicly reporting information about the Canadian health system. He is a member of the Strategic Analytic Advisory Committee of the Canadian Institute of Health Information. He was previously Scientific Director, Analyses and Evaluation of Health Systems at the National Institute of Public Health and the inaugural Deputy Commissioner, Performance Appraisal and Analysis at the Health and Welfare Commission in Quebec. His research focuses on healthcare performance, particularly in terms of how different models of care impact on patient outcomes and experiences of care, and on the analysis of Primary Care Reform.

Dr. Sabrina Wong is a nurse and health services researcher at the University of British Columbia with an appointment within the School of Nursing and at the Centre for Health Services and Policy Research. Her research examines the organization and delivery of health care services within the context of primary health care. She is a recognized leader in research involving patient-reported quality of care. Her work contributes to informing practice and system level interventions that seek to decrease health inequalities among Canadian residents, including people who face multiple disadvantages in accessing and using the health care system. Her long-standing commitment to research has contributed to

further understanding and application of primary health care in helping to reduce health and health care inequalities. She is currently one of the principal investigators for TRANSFORMATION--improving the science and reporting of performance measurement in primary health care.
